1. Outline progress over the last 6 months (April – September) against the agreed project implementation timetable (if your project started less than 6 months ago, please report on the period since start up to end of September).

Humana People to People Laos (HPPL) and the partner Lao Biodiversity Association (LBA) started the new project funded by Darwin Initiative on the 01st of July 2024. 6 Field Officers and one project Leader were employed and initiated the project with a Baseline survey in three of the 12 focus villages in the three districts: Mahaxay, Khunkham, and Ngomalath. The survey questionnaire was based on the relevant indicators from the project application and will be used throughout the project to measure progress compared to the farmers' starting point. The baseline questions to the villagers included their resent food consumption, the present use of herbs, the state of the community forest, the use and management of the forest, and the cutting of trees for use or sale during the last half year.

The Field Officers introduced the project to the village authorities and the people of 10 of the 12 villages and found a pronounced eagerness to participate. Many people in the villages use the forest for food supplies and know the effects of many herbal medicines because knowledge from their ancestors has trickled down through generations and is still used. People are eager to learn more about herbal medicine to participate in maintaining and recovering forests and expanding their agriculture businesses.

The field staff and the villagers established Farmers' Clubs with their subgroups in 10 villages, and each Farmers' Club selected its own committees. The participants went to see the areas they had chosen for demonstration gardens, which they will use in the Farmers' Clubs to learn conservation agriculture methods and organic vegetable production. The demonstration gardens are between 2,500 and 3,000 m2.

The MOU for the project was signed by the Government and Humana People to People Laos the 16<sup>th</sup> of September, 2024, with participants from the districts, province and relevant ministries, The Governments participants included a total of 40 people, 33 men and 07 women. They expressed their satisfaction with the idea and plans of the project which they know is very important for the environment and for the people in the villages. Conclusion on the first three months of the project:

- 500 people in 10 villages have signed up for the project. (missing 2 villages to be added in Qt 3)
- 2. A Baseline survey performed
- 3. 10 Farmer's Clubs with demonstration gardens established.
- 4. MOU signed with the Provincial Government.

The plan for the first 3 months has been followed except for the establishment of 2 project villages which were postponed until Qt 3.

2. Give details of any notable problems or unexpected developments/lessons learnt that the project has encountered over the last 6 months. Explain what impact these could have on the project and whether the changes will affect the budget and timetable of project activities.

Two villages in Gnomalath District were not ready to participate in the project. The villagers are from the Makong ethnic group, and because of their beliefs, they did not feel ready to participate.

Recognizing the importance of community participation, the District authorities proactively identified 2 other villages near the Phu Hin Boun protected area. This decision was well-informed, as the authorities already had other villages in mind that could participate. The project introduction, membership establishment, and formation of Farmers' Clubs for these two villages were rescheduled to Qt 3 (October, November, and December).

The project could solve this challenge without any changes in the program or budget.

With the reallocation of the purchase of trees, the project manager confirmed that the expense budget is to be used within the first financial year.
