#### Familiarization meeting

Familiarization meeting was conducted in Bahir Dar (location 1) with stakeholders [23M,10F] at project start. The meeting was helpful to create shared momentum, build trust and lay the foundations for successful collaboration. During the meeting participants reflected that the project is ground-breaking for the agriculture sector. They acknowledged that they knew about pollination services in the abstract, but did not appreciate the full import. "We did not recognize how pollination, pollinators, and the ecosystems are functioning. This occasion has opened our eyes to think about ecosystem services". Overall, the event was helpful to anticipate the project result, and to create a sense of ownership among stakeholders on the implementation of the project.

A second familiarization workshop was held in Arba Minch with 21 stakeholders (15M,6F). **Demonstration technique to show consequence of insect deprivation** 

We are developing a demonstration technique to show the impact of insect deprivation development. We identified a range of 'candidate crops' and selected three to test the demonstration. We developed a demonstration protocol (how to conduct the demonstration.

demonstration. We developed a demonstration protocol (how to conduct the demonstration, frequency of monitoring, what parameters should be collected as data) and we are now testing three crops. The Development Agents are also testing the demo technique. Candidate crops which are highly dependent on insect pollinators have been selected - avocado, apple and niger. The demonstrations have been set up in farmers' fields – to afford opportunity for

learning, as well as testing the technique to see if it can be easily replicated and used more widely.

### Pollination Training Toolkit (PTT) document development

PTT document development is underway. A draft PTT document has been developed by all parties, including experts from project partner organizations (BFD, BFDE, Bahir Dar University and PAN-Ethiopia). The core part of the document is a set of seven training tools. These seven tools have been introduced to our stakeholders. Orientation training for a small group of DAs and experts was conducted in September – showing them how to use the tools and giving them the confidence to test the tools with farmers. The purpose of the pre-test is to gain feedback from Development Agents and farmers about the simplicity, ease of use and learning achieved. The pre-test training using the toolkit has already started in 4 kebeles with 20 farmers (5 farmers in each kebele). Also during the orientation training all staff and Development Agents received training on adult education techniques.

Overall, the project is going well as per our assumptions.

There is no notable problems. One feedback point that we have received from stakeholders is a request that the Pollination Training Toolkit is created in Amharic as well as in English. We have accepted this feedback. This change do not affect the budget and the timetable of the project.
